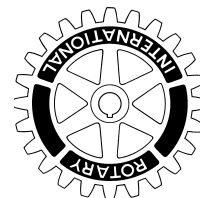

On February 2nd, 2000 the entire nation will be conducting a one-day career awareness program called "Groundhog Job Shadow Day" and here in Ocean County we need you, our local Rotarians, to get involved. Jackson Club Announces Ambassadorial Scholar

Erin Gleason, a 1995 graduate of Jackson Memorial High School, has been awarded a one-year Rotary Foundation Ambassadorial Scholarship for the year 2000-2001. This scholarship is for one academic year in a foreign country of Miss Gleason's choice. She has tentatively scheduled herself to study at the Universita di Genova in Genoa, Italy. Her second choice is the University of Bologna, also in Italy.

Before graduating from JMHS, Miss Gleason participated in varsity softball for four years. Simultaneously, she was training for international competition in speed skating. This training culminated in her representing the United States in the 1998 Olympics in Nagano, Japan. Her specialties were the 3,000-meter relays and the 500-meter individual sprint. In 1996 Miss Gleason became the American record holder in both the 1,500-meter and 1,000-meter speed skating event. Upon the conclusion of the 1998 Winter Olympics, Miss Gleason studied for a semester in Turin, Italy.

While in high school, Miss Gleason was a member of the National Honor Society and graduated with a 4,269 grade point average. She has attended college at Northern Michigan University, where she was on the Dean's List as well as the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. She is currently studying at Georgetown University in Washington, D.C., majoring in international business.

Miss Gleason is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence Gleason of Jackson. She has a brother, Jason, and sister, Kerri, both of whom also graduated from JMHS.

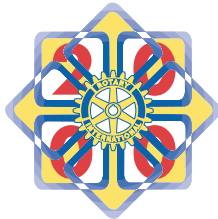
