We have an excellent line up of speakers including the keynote address by Monty Ardinart, past RI Vice President, on "Our Moral Compass" which is also the theme for this year's event. In addition, we have Mike Colasurdo, Sr., current RI Director and Treasurer and Kevin Cummings, current CEO of Investor Savings Bank as two very dynamic speakers, in the afternoon. We are working on a third speaker and some entertainment for the afternoon. We look forward to your participation and support for the upcoming Assembly and if your club would like to display a vocational service project, space will be made available for you.

We don't care how long GoWell spends typing in all the RYLA Applications, and we don't care how many typing mistakes might be eliminated.

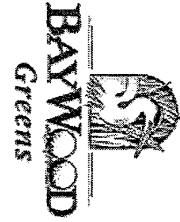
So, please! For the love of Club Rights and our independence, do NOT tell your students to go to www.ryla7500.org and fill out a RYLA application!

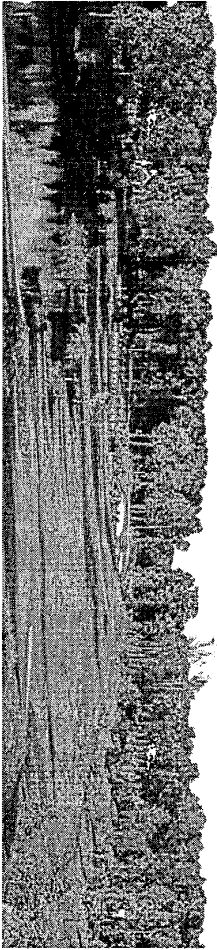

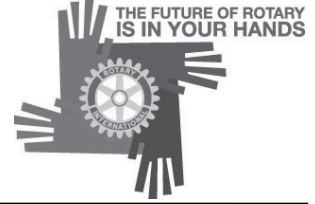
